2 – Exodus 2 > The birth of Moses

3 - Exodus 13:21-22 – Daytime cloud pillar and night time pillar of fire > ²¹ By day the LORD went ahead of them in a pillar of cloud to guide them on their way and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night. ²² Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night left its place in front of the people.

4 - Exodus 3:13-15 – God tells Moses how to explaining His identity to the Israelites - Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?'' God said to Moses, ''I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'' God also said to Moses, ''Say to the Israelites, 'The LORD, the God of your fathers--the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob--has sent me to you.' This is my name forever, the name by which I am to be remembered from generation to generation.

5 - Deuteronomy 6:4-9 – The Shema expresses that God must be loved and obeyed at all times and are guidelines for teaching the family and children about God and the Bible at home. This is the essence of Judaism! These words are inscribed on small scrolls contained in a box called a mezzuzah fastened to the doorpost of Jewish homes and with a small mezzuzah like a cylinder around the neck on a chain. -⁴ Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ⁵ Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your strength. ⁶ These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. ⁷ Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. ⁸ Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. ⁹ Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.

6 – Exodus 5:1-6:9 – Moses and Aaron appearing before the Egyptian Pharoah ten times requesting Pharoah to Let my people go from Egypt. Phaoah's ressiting Moses and Aaron's request ten times with a plague after each no answer.

7/8 - Exodus 16:2-12 – Israel's grumblings about God's daily provision for wilderness life - In the desert the whole community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the LORD's hand in Egypt!

10 - Exodus 17:8-16 – Israel battles the Amalakites, Aaron and Hur assist weary Moses to keep his arms raised until sunset, teamwork. - - - ¹⁴ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write this on a scroll as something to be remembered and make sure that Joshua hears it, because I will completely blot out the memory of Amalek from under heaven." ¹⁵ Moses built an altar and called it The LORD is my Banner. ¹⁶ He said, "For hands were lifted up to the throne of the LORD. The LORD will be at war against the Amalekites from generation to generation."

11 - Exodus 18:13-26 – Jethro's advice enables Moses to assist more people – teamwork, discipleship The next day Moses took his seat to serve as judge for the people, and they stood around him from morning till evening. When his father-in-law saw all that Moses was doing for the people, he said, "What is this you are doing for the people? Why do you alone sit as judge, while all these people stand around you from morning till evening?" Moses answered him, "Because the people come to me to seek God's will. ¹⁶ Whenever they have a dispute, it is brought to me, and I decide between the parties and inform them of God's decrees and laws." ¹⁷ Moses' father-in-law replied, "What you are doing is not good. ¹⁸ You and these people who come to you will only wear yourselves out. The work is too heavy for you; you cannot handle it alone. ¹⁹ Listen now to me and I will give you some advice, and may God be with you. You must be the people's representative before God and bring their disputes to him. ²⁰ Teach them the decrees and laws, and show them the way to live and the duties they are to perform. ²¹ But select capable men from all the people--men who fear God, trustworthy men who hate dishonest gain--and appoint them as officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens. ²² Have them serve as judges for the people at all times, but have them bring every difficult case to you; the simple cases they can decide themselves. That will make your load lighter, because they will share it with you.

²³ If you do this and God so commands, you will be able to stand the strain, and all these people will go home satisfied." ²⁴ Moses listened to his father-in-law and did everything he said. ²⁵ He chose capable men from all Israel and made them leaders of the people, officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens. ²⁶ They served as judges for the people at all times. The difficult cases they brought to Moses, but the simple ones they decided themselves.

12 – Exodus 12:1-5. The Passover Lamb. - ¹ The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in Egypt, ² "This month is to be for you the first month, the first month of your year. ³ Tell the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man is to take a lamb for his family, one for each household. ⁴ If any household is too small for a whole lamb, they must share one with their nearest neighbor, having taken into account the number of people there are. You are to determine the amount of

lamb needed in accordance with what each person will eat.

⁵ The animals you choose must be year-old males without defect, and you may take them from the sheep or the goats. - . John 1;29 – Earthly ministry of Lamb of God introduced.

13 - John 1;12 Salvation in Christ: Believing – Receiving – Becoming – Jesus declaring the *I AM* statements from John's Gospel. *I'm the true vine* > John 15:1-5; *I am the bread of life* > John 6:35-48; *I am the way, the truth, the life*. John 14:1-6; *I am the light of the world* > John 8:12-9:5; *I am the resurrection and the life* > John 11:25; *I am the gate/door* > John 11;25.

14 - The Ten Commandments from God. Exodus 20.

17 - 1 Corinthians 10:11 - These things happened to them as examples and were written down as warnings for us, on whom the fulfillment of the ages has come.

18 – Deuteronomy 34 > The death of Moses – God buried Moses.
